

City struggling to cope with fallout of policy that reduced window for successful asylum seekers to vacate Home Office housing



People with No Recourse to Public Funds (NRPF)

- No access to social security support
- Practical and material assistance
- Often at risk of exploitation and modern slavery
- Around 175,000 children affected
- Four times more likely to be behind on at least one essential bill (81% against 20% for the UK population)

Afghan resettlement scheme

 UK Government resettlement scheme – over 12,000 Afghans were resettled because at risk

We must protect people and children seeking sanctuary on our shores

URGENT: Please support our calls for a compassionate and fair asylum system

We believe that our asylum system should be just and compassionate. The Illegal Migration Bill will effectively remove the right to claim asylum and will leave people in need of sanctuary with no support and at risk of detention or deportation to Rwanda.

Many people who are forced to flee their homes in desperate circumstances simply have no other choice. If this bill becomes law, thousands of people forced to flee their homes who need a safe haven will not be able to find safety and security in the UK. We believe this Bill lacks humanity and respect for human dignity.

If passed in its current form, this Bill will:

- Effectively remove the right to seek asylum and find sanctuary in the UK;
- Place thousands of people in detention centres, including children;
- · Tear families apart;
- Leave thousands of people at risk of destitution and homelessness.

BACKGROUND

The past year has seen more people lose their lives as they try to cross the Channel to seek sanctuary in the UK. Those who arrive in the UK face a long wait for a decision on their claim, are housed in unsuitable and unsafe accommodation while they wait and are isolated from the communities they could be a part of. 2023 also saw a piece of legislation – the Illegal Migration Act being passed by Parliament. This Act has effectively removed the right to seek asylum to the point where it is impossible for most people arriving here to claim asylum and seek safety. This Act, and the Nationality and Borders Act 2022, have created an environment where people seeking asylum are subject to hostility, fear, and long periods of uncertainty. They now also face the threat of being removed to Rwanda before their asylum claim can be heard in the UK.
