

- Gathered information from the prisons group
- Spent time in both Approved Premises
- Spoken to service users
- Attended a variety of meetings
- Captured information on projects and members work

#### Summary of what SVP has been doing

- There are have been three distinct areas of work that support offenders within the SVP
  - Members work
  - CSP work
  - Approved Premises
- These areas tend to work in isolation and although some amazing work is done in each area the crossover is limited

#### **Members work**


- Attending services
